How can we serve the diverse needs of the neighborhood - renters (short and long term)? homeowners? students & older residents? Families? Working people? People of color? Bring your ideas and your energy.

Neighborhoods 101-Recap

The energy was high at the January 28 Community meeting, and the discussion relevant to the future of PPA. Ariah Fine, from the Minneapolis Neighborhood Programs, talked with participants about the importance of showing up, and how the new Minneapolis Neighborhoods 2020 plan for neighborhoods will affect Prospect Park. We must serve **all** the residents of our neighborhood. Additionally, the funding structure for PPA will change, and the engagement of the community/neighborhood must be reflected in the board of the organization. "The Neighborhoods 2020 vision is to have an inclusive community where all people are valued, all communities are engaged, and leadership mirrors the great diversity of the city." How we make that happen is up to us.

The bottom line is we encourage you to show up...get engaged!

Oral History Project Celebration

Last fall, 10 volunteers from Prospect Park, Marcy Holmes, and Southeast Como began working with Erica Selzer-Schultz, a local oral historian, to learn about and collect *Neighborhood Stories and Memories* from residents 65 and over from the same neighborhoods. Sponsored by Southeast Seniors with support from the Prospect Park Association, the Good Neighbor Fund (from UMN), the PP Co-op Legacy Fund and the MN Historical Society, the project concluded with a celebration on Sunday, February 3 at the Southeast Seniors office, 2828 University Ave SE, Minneapolis, MN 55414.

Many joined in to hear from Lydia McAnerney, Coordinator of the project, Erica Selzer-Schultz, Oral Historian, and some of the people involved. 15 people 65 or older in Marcy Holmes, Prospect Park or Southeast Como were interviewed. The interviews were recorded and the transcribed. Watch for information on how to access these on the Southeast Seniors website in the near future.
