

'25% by '25' Initiative Update

This is the last year of the "25% by '25" initiative that the PPA Environment Committee started back in 2021 to bring residential natural gas usage down in Prospect Park. (For more information on this initiative, please visit our website at <u>https://prospectparkmpls.org/ppa/committees/environment.html.</u>)

As a community, we've already cut our natural gas usage by 8.37%, or the equivalent of 73 houses or 114 gas fueled cars.

We highly recommend getting a home energy audit as a starting point. I'm happy to tell folks that **you can get an audit for free** right now from MNCEE. <u>https://www.mncee.org/home-energy-squad.</u> Phone: 651-328-6220

Also, for those of you who had energy upgrades done in 2024, be sure to apply for your IRA tax credit. Here is the link - <u>https://www.irs.gov/forms-pubs/about-form-5695</u>. You may be eligible for as much as \$2000, depending on your type of upgrade.
