Due to Covid19, the annual neighborhood clean sweep that usually happens in September, will <u>not</u> happen this year.



On Tuesday, August 18, Census Representatives were available to answer questions and help Glendale residents complete their census questionnaires. We estimate that 30 households were counted at the event. Kids and adults enjoyed Census swag, treats and a beautiful summer evening of social distancing. Remember: Counting Every Person Truly Matters

Missing just one person in the census will results in loss of over \$27,000 of federal funding to the State of Minnesota over the 10 years, until the next census in 2030. Get counted! Prospect Park has an expected undercount of 2,500 people, which could lead to the loss of \$67,500,000 that could be put directly into community funding.


